## The Four Sennenhund Breeds

Left to Right: Greater Swiss Mountain Dog , Bernese Mountain Dog, Appenzeller, Entlebucher



Sennenhund, also known as Swiss Mountain Dogs or Swiss Cattle Dogs are dogs that originated in the Swiss Alps. They were farm dogs. There are four different breed but all have the same tri color coat. They can have other colors but those colors should not be bred as this is not desired except for the Appenzeller who is allowed to be a brown color. They range in size from medium to large. The two larger breeds, the swissy & the berner have a heavier build and have a calmer temperament while the two smaller breeds the entlebucher and appenzeller are smaller built, more agile and busy.

These breeds are said to have come from the Roman molossers. The word Senn is from the term for Alpine herdsman and dairymen who tend cattle and sheep. Sennenhund means “dogs of the Senn”. The Sennenhund breeds were not just cattle or sheep dogs, they were kept as general farm dogs. They worked livestock, guarded sheep and watched after the farmers families, homes and their herds and flocks. The larger two Sennenhunds were also used to pull carts full of products for the farmer.

## Spring Smoothie Biscuits For Your Dog

Does your dog like Strawberries and bananas? If they do this is just the recipe for them and with strawberries in season it won't be hard to find the ingredients.

Ingredients needed:

1/2 cup Strawberries  
1 medium Banana  
1/4 cup Milk  
1 1/4 cup Whole Wheat Flour  
1/2 teaspoon Vanilla Extract

Directions:

Preheat your oven to 350 degrees.

Mash or puree the strawberries and bananas & mix together.

Combine the strawberries and the bananas with the rest of the ingredients until well mixed.

Roll out dough on heavily floured surface (the dough is very sticky) 1/4 inch thick. Cut into shapes with any cutter you choose. Place cookies 1 inch apart on ungreased cookie sheets, poke each cookie with a fork to prevent air bubbles. Cook for 15-20 minutes.

Cool and refrigerate.

# Herding Trial May 9, 2015

The CGSMDC is very happy to sponsor the upcoming herding trial. The event will take place on May 9th, 2015 at PackLeader Farms in Gig Harbor.

This trial will allow your dog to demonstrate their herding ability. A dog does not need to be exposed to stock prior to the instinct test. It can be helpful but is not necessary. Come and join us and help your dog earn a ABHA title. To achieve a title your dog needs to have 2 passing runs. Each HCT (Herding Capability Test) is \$25.00 and a JHD (Junior Herding Dog) is \$30.00. We are offering the HCT for the beginners and the JHD title for the dogs that have had a couple lessons.



Many of you expressed an interest in these kinds of activities so hurry and enter as space is limited and you wouldn't want to miss out on the fun.

You don't need to reserve both runs. You can reserve the first run and if space is available the day of the event you can then pay for the second run.

We also will have a General Club Membership meeting and a free lunch to club members. All club members are invited to join us for lunch and for a fun day, you don't need to enter your dog to join us.

# The Road to Becoming an AKC Obedience and Rally Judge

I have been very active in competing in both AKC obedience and rally events. My interest in the sport has grown beyond competing. One night a week, I volunteer to teach others how to train their dogs. I've also been fulfilling the requirements to become an AKC rally and obedience judge. As I near completing the first phase of the journey to become an obedience and rally judge, I wanted to share what it takes to become a judge.

Before you can apply to become either an obedience or rally judge you have to complete five requirements and be active in the sport for six years. The first requirement is to earn a Utility Dog (UD) title on one dog and to earn a Companion Dog (CD) title on a second dog. To become a rally judge you need to earn a Rally Excellent (RE) title and a Companion Dog Excellent (CDX) title and both titles can be on the same dog.

The second requirement is to steward at rally and obedience shows. At some point you have to be what's called a table steward at least once. The table steward works directly with the judge helping to keep the judge organized during the day. Many competitors

do not appreciate the amount of work it requires to keep a ring functioning smoothly. A good judge and their stewards make it look easy.

Actual judging of dogs is the third requirement. You fulfill this requirement by either apprentice judging or judging at AKC sanctioned matches. As an apprentice judge you work with a judge at a show. Both you and the judge score the dogs and afterwards you compare your scoring with the judge to see how you did. The judge completes an evaluation of your judging and knowledge of the regulations and submits it to the AKC. At a sanctioned match, you are the judge.

The fourth requirement is that you work or volunteer teaching others how to train their dogs. The fifth requirement is passing a test on the rally or obedience regulations. After completing these five requirements, you can apply to become an obedience or rally judge. After successful completion of the application and acceptance by the AKC, you become a provisional judge.

As a provisional judge you can judge at regular dog shows. To become a regular judge you have to judge a certain number of dogs and be observed by an AKC delegate. After you've judge the required number of dogs, had a successful observation, and are approved by the AKC, then you move from provisional status to regular status.

For judging rally, once you are a provisional judge you can judge all rally classes – Novice, Advanced, and Excellent. For obedience, you are only approved to judge Novice. You have to repeat this process for each of the other regular obedience classes Open and Utility. That means you have to apprentice judge Open, become an Open provisional, judge the required amount of Open dogs, be observed by an AKC delegate and then you become a regular Open judge. Repeat once more for Utility.

The journey is long and requires commitment to complete. I have enjoyed the journey. I have learned so many things and met so many new friends. By the end of this year or early next, I'll be a provisional Rally judge and a Novice Obedience judge. My goal is by 2018 to become a regular judge for Open and Utility.



#### **Old Buisness:**



## Cascade Greater Swiss Mountain Dog Club Member Guidelines

1. Members shall be aware at all times that the Club exists to protect the breed and that these aims are to be reflected in all activities involving the breed.
2. At home and while away from home at shows, lodging establishments, and public places, members will display good sportsmanship and conduct themselves in such a manner as to reflect favorably upon the CGSMDC and the breed.  
Members shall:
  - a. Be diligent in the handling of their properly restrained GSMD/s to minimize the risk of trauma, danger, or nuisance to any human being or another animal.
  - b. Recognize their responsibility to protect the name and reputation of the breed.
  - c. Be respectful of all members and be sure that shared assessments of a member's GSMD are constructive.
  - d. Refrain from destructive criticism of another's dog and from personal attacks upon fellow members.
3. GSMD owners and their breeders are encouraged to remain in contact for advice and to update each other on the progress of parents and offspring.
4. Members are encouraged to seek the advice and assistance of experienced owners and to willingly educate and cooperate with each other.
5. Members agree to educate the public and to honestly represent the breed at all times. This includes making sure interested persons are aware of all general and genetic health problems. Members asked about the current/future availability of puppies should refer the public to the Club's Corresponding Secretary or the CGSMDC web site.
6. Members shall not sell or give away any GSMD/s for raffle prize purposes, or to any dog wholesalers, pet shops, other retailers, or laboratories (other than veterinary research facilities for the betterment of the breed).
7. If a member becomes aware of the maltreatment, misuse or need for relocation of any GSMD, they will notify any or all of the following for resolution of the problem: the breeder (if known), a Club member actively involved in GSMD rescue, a member of the Board of Directors, or the correct authorities in their area.
8. Members shall not use Club resources for personal or private gain, nor engage in conduct antithetical to the Club's purpose and/or integrity.
9. All GSMDs owned or in the care of members shall be given a healthy environment, good nutrition, and veterinary care as well as proper training that includes regular contact with people and exposure to the outside world.
  - a. No member's GSMD may be treated in an inhumane manner, abused, or subjected to any conditions likely to endanger the animal's life.
  - b. No member should have more GSMDs than their facilities can adequately hold.
